First Generation

1. **James (Seamus) SULLIVAN** was born about 1812 in probably Caheraveelane, Glantane, Co. Cork. He died on 5 Nov 1882 at the age of 70 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. It is believed Seamus was born in the townland of Caheraveelane in the civil parish of Kilshannig and in the Catholic parish of Glantane (near the village of Nad or Nadd) in Co. Cork. The Sullivans from Caheraveelane were known as the 'Caher' or 'Cahera' (pronounced 'kawra') Sullivans, presumably to distinguish them from the other Sullivan families in the area. They used the surname 'Sullivan' prior to the early 20th century when they started using the name 'O'Sullivan which would have been their ancestors' original name. Note that Caheraveelane seems to be spelled nowadays as Caheravellane.

Apparently Lyre church is much nearer to Caherveelane than Glantane church so it is possible Seamus and perhaps his children were baptised in Lyre rather than Glantane. It is also possible they were baptised in Donoughmore church.

At some point Seamus moved a few miles east to the townland of Glynn in the parish of Mourneabbey (also spelled Mourne Abbey), although it is not known exactly when. Griffith's Valuation, which was carried out in 1851 for Mourneabbey, does not show any record of land in Glynn being occupied at that time by a Seamus or James Sullivan, although it seems likely he had left Caheraveelane by then. Griffith's Valuation was carried out for the Glantane/Kilshannig area in 1852 and shows that the only Sullivan to occupy land in Caheraveelane was a Johanna Sullivan who rented 234 acres along with a "turbary" (bog or right to dig turf).

Seamus died aged 70 of paralysis and dropsy from which he had been suffering for two years. The informant on his death record was his son Daniel.

Seamus was related in some way to another Sullivan family from Caheraveelane. A descendant of a Daniel Sullivan of Caheraveelane (born about 1800), who still lives in Caheraveelane, recalls his father talking about Sullivan relatives in Mourneabbey. It is possible that Seamus was a son of this Daniel. Any assistance in establishing a definite link between the two families would be much appreciated.

Note: The Mallow Heritage Centre found baptism records for two James Sullivans in Donoughmore parish which seems to be the Catholic parish (as opposed to the civil parish) for Caheraveelane:

But there is nothing to suggest that either of these baptisms relate to our Séamus.

Caheraveelane comprises about 234 acres of mostly mountainy land. As evidenced by summaries from the 1841 to 1891 censuses of Ireland it was a very sparsely populated townland in those years. Details - from www.eppi.ac.uk, the EPPI (Enhanced Parliamentary Papers on Ireland, 1801-1922) website - are as follows:

No details by household are available as the census returns from these years no longer exist. It seems likely that Seamus left Caheraveelane in the 1830s or 1840s, probably because there was no living to be made on its poor land. Other Sullivans, whose numbers contribute to the population figures given above and of whom I have some information, remained and these are probably related to our Sullivan family but I haven't yet been able to establish a definite link.

I have been told that Sonia O'Sullivan, the well-known Irish athlete, is a descendant of the Caher Sullivans (although her O'Sullivan grandfather was apparently a native of Dublin) but I have been unable to verify this. I suspect there is no connection but would love to come across information that would indicate that there is in fact a link. Interestingly, several other descendants of the Caher Sullivans have been talented sportspeople, e.g., Jerry O'Sullivan who enjoyed success in boxing in Britain prior to emigrating to Australia; his brother Eugene (1927-1967), a distance runner who was selected to represent Australia at the 1956 Olympics; and Arthur Sullivan (born in 1884 in Caheraveelane), another fine distance runner.

The O'Sullivan surname is the third most common surname in Ireland, with four out of five O'Sullivan families in the country living in counties Cork and Kerry where O'Sullivan is the most common surname. The original Irish surname was 'O Suileabháin', deriving possibly from 'suil dubh án' meaning 'dark-eyed'. It is possible that the O Suileabháin families originated in South Tipperary from where they were driven out in the 13th century by the O'Briens and the Normans. Most settled in west Cork and Kerry. By the end of the 14th century, the O Suileabháins had split into at least seven different groupings, the most impportant of which were (i) Clann Gilla Mochuda of south Kerry, who in the 16th century, changed their name completely to McGillycuddy, (ii) the O'Sullivan Mór, based on the shores of Kenmare Bay, and (iii) the O'Sullivan Beare, rulers of the area around Bantry and of the Beara peninsula of Co. Cork. I am presuming therefore that my O'Sullivan family is descended from the O'Sullivan Beare. James (Seamus) SULLIVAN and 'UNKNOWN' were married.

'UNKNOWN' died before 5 Nov 1882 in probably Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. It is possible Seamus's wife's name was Ellen because his son and daughter-in-law Dan and Mary named their second daughter Ellen. There was a tradition at the time of namning the first or second daughter after the maternal or paternal grandmother. Dan and Mary's second daughter was named Johanna, after her maternal grandmother, suggesting that their first daughter, i.e. Ellen, would have been named after her paternal grandmother. Of course it could have been the case that Seamus's wife's name was Johanna, i.e. sharing the same name as Mary's mother.

James (Seamus) SULLIVAN and 'UNKNOWN' had the following children:

- +2 i **Michael SULLIVAN (caution: not verified)**, born abt 1838, probably Caheraveelane, Glantane, Co. Cork; married Margaret DILWORTH, 3 Feb 1866, Aghabologue, Co. Cork; died probably Co. Cork.
- +3 ii **Daniel (Dan) SULLIVAN**, born abt 1840, Caheraveelane, Kilshannig; or Glynn, Mourneabbey; married Mary DOODY, 20 Jan 1880, Galbally, Co. Limerick; died bet 2 Apr 1911 and 23 Mar 1936, probably Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.
- +4 iii **Mary (Big Mary) SULLIVAN**, born Caheraveelane, Kilshannig; or Glynn, Mourneabbey; married Daniel (Danny) MURPHY; died aft prob 2 Apr 1911.
- +5 iv **James (Big Jim) SULLIVAN**, born ABOUT LATE 1840S, Caheraveelane, Glantane; or Glynn, Mourneabbey; married Julia DOODY, 1 Mar 1881, Galbally, Co. Limerick; died 24 Dec 1903, South Infirmary, Cork.
- +6 v Hanora (Nora) SULLIVAN, born abt 1848, Caheraveelane, Kilshannig; or Glynn,

Second Generation

2. **Michael SULLIVAN (caution: not verified)** (James (Seamus)-1) was born about 1838 in probably Caheraveelane, Glantane, Co. Cork. He died in probably Co. Cork. Michael was in some way closely related to Séamus (James); it is thought he was a son or a nephew. Could he have been the Michael Sullivan whose father's name was James and who was living in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork at the time of his marriage on 3 February 1866 in Aghabologue, Dromatimore, Co. Cork ito Margaret Dilworth of Aghabologue?

Michael was a railway official, according to the marriage record of his son, also named Michael. Although we know of the existence of only one child of Michael's (i.e., Michael), it is of course possible that Michael senior and his wife had more children. Michael SULLIVAN (caution: not verified) and Margaret DILWORTH were married on 3 Feb 1866 in Aghabologue, Co. Cork.

Margaret DILWORTH, daughter of 'unknown' DILWORTH, was born about 1837 in probably Aghabologue, Dromatimore, Co. Cork. I have seen Margaret's surname documented as Deloury as well as Dilworth. According to MacLysaght's 'The Surnames of Ireland', the names are synonymous.

Michael SULLIVAN and Margaret DILWORTH had the following children:

- i **James SULLIVAN** was born on 15 Mar 1867 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.
- +8 ii **Michael O'SULLIVAN**, born 4 Apr 1869, Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Catherine MCDERMOTT, 22 Jan 1899, Ballyhea, Charleville, Co. Cork; died 5 Sep 1938, South Infirmary, Cork.
- 9 iii Ellen SULLIVAN was born on 25 Oct 1871 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.
- iv **John SULLIVAN** was born on 8 Oct 1875 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.
- 3. **Daniel (Dan) SULLIVAN** (James (Seamus)-1) was born about 1840 in Caheraveelane, Kilshannig; or Glynn, Mourneabbey. He died between 2 Apr 1911 and 23 Mar 1936 at the age of 71 in probably Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. Dan met his wife, Mary Doody from Galbally, Co. Limerick through one of her brothers. Sometime in the 1870s, this brother (it is not known if it was James, John, Mike or Richard) arrived in the Glynn area from Galbally looking for a job. He had failed a secondary school exam, and because of of trouble at home as a result, he had left Galbally to go looking for work. Dan's father, Séamus, took him in. In his free time, Mary's brother used to join Dan and his brother, Jim, in their athletic pursuits. One day, the boys were pole-vaulting and Mary's brother broke his arm; his mother was contacted and so she made the journey by carriage from Galbally to Glynn. When her son told her of the generosity of the Sullivans, she invited them to Galbally for a visit. When Dan went to Galbally, he met Mary, and they later married. Just over a year after the marriage, Mary's sister Julia married Dan's brother Jim.

According to the 1901 census, Dan's property in Glynn had a piggery, cow-house and stable. The roof of the house was made of "thatch, wood or other perishable material". Daniel (Dan) SULLIVAN and Mary DOODY were married on 20 Jan 1880 in Galbally, Co. Limerick. Witnesses to the marriage of Dan and Mary were Robert Love and Julia Doody. Robert Love was a family friend; he was a policeman stationed in the Galbally area and was a brother of the man who would eventually purchase the Ballyknockin farm of Dan's brother, Jim, following the eviction of Jim's family.

Dan's residence at the time of his marriage was Ballinamona (which is the registration area in which Glynn is located). Mary's residence was Ardnamoher, Galbally.

Mary DOODY, daughter of Michael DOODY and Johanna QUIRKE, was born about 21 Sep 1854 in Knockainy or Galbally, Co. Limerick. She was christened on 21 Sep 1854 in Galbally, Co. Limerick. She died on 23 Mar 1936 at the age of 81 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Mary was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. Sponsors at Mary's baptism were Thomas Quirke and Mary Fahy.

Mary and Dan are buried in the O'Sullivan plot in Donoughmore cemetery, although their names are not listed on the headstone.

Daniel (Dan) SULLIVAN and Mary DOODY had the following children:

- i **Ellen O'SULLIVAN** was born about 20 Nov 1880 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She was christened on 20 Nov 1880 in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Ellen is listed, aged 30 and single, in the 1911 census return for her parents' household, suggesting that she still lived in the family home. Unfortunately we have no further information on Ellen.
- ii **Johanna SULLIVAN** was born on 23 Jan 1882 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. We have no further information on Johanna.
- +13 iii **James (Jamesy Dan) O'SULLIVAN**, born abt 10 Jan 1883, Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Catherine (Kate) MURPHY; died Jun 1966.
 - iv Michael O'SULLIVAN was born about 3 Oct 1884 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 3 Oct 1884 in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died about 1900 at the age of 16 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. According to a family source, Michael died at the age of 15 following an accident on the farm in Glynn involving a horse. However, I have come across the death certificate of a Michael Sullivan of Glynn who died of pneumonia in Glynn on 8 May 1897, aged 11. The informant was his mother, Mary. Although our Michael would have been 12 years old in May 1897 I think it likely that this death certificate is that of our Michael. Of course there could have been another Sullivan family with similarly named family members living in Glynn at that time.

It is not known for certain where Michael is buried but it is assumed that burial took place in the family plot in Donoughmore Cemetery in Stuake, Co. Cork.

- v **Daniel (Dan) O'SULLIVAN** was born about 26 Oct 1889 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 26 Oct 1889 in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died in Nov 1963 at the age of 74. Daniel was buried in Gouldshill Cemetery, Mallow, Co. Cork. Dan never married. He lived with his brother Jamesy Dan and his family and is buried with Jamesy Dan.
- vi **Mary O'SULLIVAN** was born on 10 Jul 1896 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Unfortunately we have no information on Mary.
- 4. **Mary (Big Mary) SULLIVAN** (James (Seamus)-1) died after probably 2 Apr 1911. She was born in Caheraveelane, Kilshannig; or Glynn, Mourneabbey. Mary (Big Mary) SULLIVAN and Daniel (Danny) MURPHY were married.

Daniel (Danny) MURPHY died before probably 2 Apr 1911. He was born in Ballyhillogue, Grenagh, Co. Cork. Danny was from Ballyhillogue in Grenagh (although Ballyhillogue now seems to be in the parish of Mourneabbey).

There is a record of the marriage of a Mary Sullivan and a Daniel Murphy in Grenagh on 26 April 1857. Witnesses were John Healy and John Denahy. However, there is no proof that the marriage related to our Mary and Danny, and one would expect anyway that the marriage would have taken place in Mourneabbey rather than Grenagh as marriages generally took place in the bride's parish.

There is also a record of the baptism of a William Murphy, son of Daniel Murphy and Mary Sullivan, in Grenagh on 8 March 1858. Presumably William's parents were Mary and Daniel above who married in April 1857. Sponsors at the baptism were Michael Murphy and Elizabeth Sullivan. However, we have no proof that William was a son of our Danny and Mary.

I am told that our Danny and Mary lived in either Ballyknockane in Mourneabbey or Ballyhillogue in Grenagh/Mourneabbey. No 1901 or 1911 census returns have been found for any Daniel Murphy in Mourneabbey, although a search of the 1901 census shows a return for the household of a 50-year-old widow named Mary Murphy who lived in Ballyhilloge (alternative spelling of Ballyhillogue) in Knockantota, Grenagh. She is listed with her sons Stephen, aged 27, and 26-year-old Daniel. The 1911 census tells us that Mary (whose age is now 68!) is living in Ballyhillogue with her son Daniel (now listed as aged 30!). Could Mary have been the wife of our Danny above? According to the 1911 census Mary had been married for 30 years and had 11 children, eight of whom were alive at the time of the census.

A birth record has been located on the Irish Genealogy for a Stephen Murphy who was born on 20 October 1880 in Ballyknockane to a Richard Murphy and Mary Sullivan. Is this Stephen from the 1901 census? Could our Mary have been married to a Richard rather than a Daniel Murphy? Any help with this Murphy family would be much appreciated. Daniel (Danny) MURPHY and Mary (Big Mary) SULLIVAN had the following child:

- i **Daniel (Danny) MURPHY** was born (date unknown). Danny never married. It is not known if he had siblings.
- 5. **James (Big Jim) SULLIVAN** (James (Seamus)-1) died on 24 Dec 1903 in South Infirmary, Cork. He was born in ABOUT LATE 1840S in Caheraveelane, Glantane; or Glynn, Mourneabbey. He was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. The exact year of Jim's birth is uncertain: his age at the time of his marriage in March 1881 is given as 30 (born about 1850); his age on the 1901 census return is given as 53 (born about 1847); and his age on his death record (dated December 1903) is 51 (born about 1852).

Jim and his brother, Dan, were well-known locally for their great strength and athletic prowess.

Jim farmed in the townland of Ballyknockane (also spelled Ballyknockin) in the parish of Mourneabbey (or Mourne Abbey). He rented land from a man by the name of Weir or Ware who was the main landlord in Ballyknockin at the time. Sometime between October 1886 and October 1887, Jim and his family were evicted. Apparently the landlord wanted to sell the land to a man by the name of Love and therefore raised the rent so much that Jim could not pay. Jim was in hospital at the time - it is said that he had got a kick from a horse - and apparently when he came out of hospital, he cut furze (for fuel) on his former property and was jailed as a result. Interestingly the Ballyknockin farm was owned (around 2005) by a great-great-grandson of Jim's (i.e., one of Patrick O'Hanlon's sons).

Following the eviction, Jim's brother Dan, who lived in the nearby townland of Glyn, gave them shelter. The county council eventually built a cottage for Jim's family in Glynn on an acre of land given to them by Dan. The cottage is still there (2024) but is derelict and obscured from view by vegetation. It is located on the roadside near the laneway to the farm now owned by Dan's descendants.

Jim's death record tells us he died of (a) "haematemisis [vomiting of blood] and debility" and (b) "Exhaustion", conditions from which he been suffering for four days.

Besides all the members of the Sullivan family listed on these pages, there was also an Emily Sullivan but we

do not know how she fits in. We know of her existence from an old prayer book once owned by Ellen, a daughter of Jim and his wife, Julia, in which is written "Emly (sic) Sullivan, Mourneabbey". The prayer book was published (by Easons) in 1903 so Emily was probably living in Mourneabbey in the early part of the 20th century. Could Ellen have called herself Emily at one time? Or could Emily have been a sister of Ellen's? Jim and Julia had 12 children born alive (nine of whom were alive at the time of the 1911 census) and we have the names of 11, missing one of the children who died. Could this have been Emily? If so she would have died between 1903 and 1911. There is only one birth record on the Irish Genealogy website for an Emily O'Sullivan/Sullivan born in the Mallow Registration District after 1881 (the year of Jim and Julia's marriage) but she was not a child of Jim and Julia's. The only death record located for an Emily O'Sullivan/Sullivan in the Mallow Registration District was for the unrelated Emily O'Sullivan above.

Jim and his brother Dan are buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork, as are several of their descendants. Donoughmore would have been the burial place for Caheraveelane people in Jim and Dan's time even though Caheraveelane was not in Donoughmore parish. Caheraveelane is part of the Catholic parish of Glantane (equivalent in Jim and Dan's time to the civil parish of Kilshannig) but Glantane (and Bweeng) cemeteries were opened only in 1936 so most burials of people from the southern end of Glantane parish took place in Donoughmore up to that year, and beyond if a family already had a plot in Donoughmore.

According to the 1901 census, Jim's property in Glynn had a piggery, but no cowhouse or stable, and the cottage had a "slate, iron or tiled roof".

Note: In almost all of the documents encountered for James, Dan and their children, the surname is listed as "Sullivan" rather than "O'Sullivan". James (Big Jim) SULLIVAN and Julia DOODY were married on 1 Mar 1881 in Galbally, Co. Limerick.



Julia DOODY, daughter of Michael DOODY and Johanna QUIRKE, was born about 4 Jul 1858 in Ardnamoher, Galbally, Co. Limerick. She was christened on 4 Jul 1858 in Galbally, Co. Limerick. She died on 8 Sep 1933 at the age of 75 in Waterford. Julia was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. Sponsors at Julia's baptism were John Doody and Catherine Quirke.

The family's address on the baptism record is Ardnamoher, a townland in Galbally. Presumably this is where Julia was born and where the family farmed. Ardnamoher is also given as Julia's residence on her marriage record. Witnesses to the marriage of Julia and her husband, Jim, were Jeremiah Herlehey (James Henebry in the church register) and Elizabeth Doody.

According to a family member, Julia was a tiny woman and extremely active.

Julia and Jim's children would have gone to school in Analeentha National School, next to Analeentha Church in Mourneabbey.

Julia died in Waterford at the home of her son Jimmy. She was buried in the Sullivan plot in Donoughmore Cemetery, Co. Cork. Note that there are two Donoughmore cemeteries, one in the centre of the village, and a newer one outside Donoughmore next to a church built around 2000. Our O'Sullivans are buried in the newer cemetery.

James (Big Jim) SULLIVAN and Julia DOODY had the following children:

i Mary Ann (Sr. Mary Munchin) O'SULLIVAN was born on 6 May 1882 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She was christened on 9 May 1882 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She died on 23 Jun 1913 at the age of 31 in Chiswick,

London. Mary was buried in Catholic Cemetery, Kensal Green, London. According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Mary's baptism were Richard Murphy and Mary O'Sullivan.

On 14 August 1909 Mary entered the convent of the Sisters of Marie Réparatrice on Windmill Road in Cork, and on 22 February 1910 she received the habit and the name Sr. Mary of St. Munchin. The Sisters of Marie Réparatrice were a closed order whose members wore pale blue robes and were known as the Blue Nuns.

Mary was only 31 years of age when she died in London in 1913 of tuberculosis of the lung and larynx. She had arrived in London, already ill, on 1 December 1911. She made her first profession in London on 25 May 1912 and died 13 months later in the Marie Réparatrice convent at Tower House, 4 Chiswick Lane, Chiswick. Mary is described in the convent journal as having been "full of virtue".

- +19 ii **James (Jimmy) O'SULLIVAN**, born 17 Dec 1883, Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Mary (Mollie) MURPHY, 10 Jun 1918, Church of St. Mary, Cahir, Co. Tipperary; died 6 Oct 1959, Waterford.
- +20 iii **Johanna (Hannah) O'SULLIVAN**, born 23 Oct 1885, Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co . Cork; married Harry WILLIAMS, 26 Apr 1915, R.C. Church of St. Mary and St. Boniface, Plymouth, Devon; died 15 Jan 1983, 106 Victory St., Plymouth, Devon.
- iv **Daniel O'SULLIVAN** was born about 20 Oct 1886 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 20 Oct 1886 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 28 Nov 1887 at the age of 1 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Daniel's baptism were William Hayes and Mary McSweeney.

It is possible that Mary McSweeney was a grandmother of Maura O'Hanlon (née O'Sullivan) who would have been a niece of Daniel's - the McSweeney/Sweeney family were neighbours of the O'Sullivans. Another connection between the Sweeneys and the Sullivans is that it is thought that Cornelius Sweeney who was the father of Mary's husband, Jeremiah, was married to a member of the Sullivan family of Caheraveelane.

Daniel died aged one of pneumonia.

- +25 viii **Denis O'SULLIVAN**, born abt 28 Jul 1895, Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Mary SWEENEY, 14 Feb 1920, Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; died 31 May 1971, Mallow, Co. Cork.
- +26 ix **Margaret (Madge) O'SULLIVAN**, born 27 Nov 1897, Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married John (Jack) LYNCH, 2 May 1918, Burnfort Church, Glantane, Co. Cork; died 21 Apr 1925, Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.
- 27 x **Richard SULLIVAN** was born on 12 Feb 1900 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 16 Mar 1900 at the age of 0 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Richard died at the age of just five weeks of acute bronchitis, the duration of which was four days.
- 28 xi **Julia O'SULLIVAN** was born on 27 Jun 1901 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She died

on 17 Feb 1920 at the age of 18 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She was christened in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Julia was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork (O'Sullivan plot). Julia died of tuberculosis aged 19. She is buried with her parents in the O'Sullivan family plot in Donoughmore cemetery, although her name is not listed on the headstone.

Note: There are two Donoughmore cemeteries, an older one in the centre of the village, and a newer in Stuake, just outside Donoughmore, next to a church built about 2001. Our O'Sullivans are buried in the newer cemetery.

- 29 xii **'unknown' SULLIVAN** died before 2 Apr 1911. He/she was born in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.
- 6. **Hanora (Nora) SULLIVAN** (James (Seamus)-1) was born about 1848 in Caheraveelane, Kilshannig; or Glynn, Mourneabbey. She died on 6 Jun 1902 at the age of 54 in 65 Commons Road, Cork. She was buried on 8 Jun 1902 in Donoughmore Cemetery, Co. Cork. Nora and her husband, Michael, moved from Mourneabbey to Cork city where they lived at 65 Commons Road. Hanora (Nora) SULLIVAN and Michael MAHONY were married on 3 May 1874 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Witnesses to the marriage were Michael Sullivan and Patrick Mahony.

Michael MAHONY, son of John MAHONY and 'UNKNOWN', was born about 1846 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 6 Jan 1919 at the age of 73 in 54 Commons Road, Cork. Michael farmed in Ballyknockane before moving to Cork city between 1874 and 1876. He was working as a labourer at the time of the birth of his daughter, Ellen, in Cork city in 1876 but was eventually employed as a railway porter.

According to his death record, Michael died at 54 Commons Road in Cork. We know he had lived for many years at 65 Commons Road, so had he moved to no. 54 at some point after the death of his wife, Nora? The informant on the death record was Nora Mahony of St. Luke's Cross, Cork who was a daughter of Michael's brother John. Michael's cause of death 'was "acute oedema of lungs, 3 days".

A Denis Mahoney of 54 Commons Road died aged about 38 of heart disease on 10 July 1902 in The North Infirmary in Cork. A great-grandson of Denis's tells me that Denis worked in the Murphys brewery and that several descendants of Denis's still (2022) live on Commons Road. Denis's father's name was John. Given the 54 Commons Road address, Denis may have been related to Michael above. Some reserach into Denis tells us he married Mary Delea on 19 July 1890 and they had six children: John, Patrick, Michael, Cornelius, William and Anne. According to the 1901 census the family was actually living at 52 Commons Road at the time.

Michael MAHONY and Hanora (Nora) SULLIVAN had the following children:

- +30 i Catherine (Kate) MAHONY, born 10 May 1874, Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Timothy LYNCH, 30 Apr 1898, Cork Cathedral; died 12 Feb 1933, 15 Kilbarry Cottages, Cork.
- 31 ii Ellen MAHONY was born on 20 Aug 1876 in 1 Heyland's Lane, Cork. We know of Ellen's existence from the 1901 and 1911 censuses which has Ellen listed with her parents (1901) and her widowered father (1911). Ellen and her father appear to have moved from 65 Commons Road, their home prior to the death of Ellen's mother in 1902, to 54 Commons Road by the time of the 1911 census.

Third Generation

8. **Michael O'SULLIVAN** (Michael-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 4 Apr 1869 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 11 Apr 1869 in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 5 Sep 1938 at the age of 69 in South Infirmary, Cork. Michael was buried in probably Charleville, Co. Cork. Michael's baptismal sponsors were Daniel Sullivan and Johanna Dilworth.

According to his marriage record, Michael was a railway official, like his father; and his occupation in both the 1901 and 1911 censuses is given as 'railway signalman'. According to his obituary in The Irish Examiner of 8 September 1935 he had worked for the G.S.R. (Great Southern Railway) for 40 years.

Michael's residence at the time of his marriage was Effin, Co. Limerick (near Kilmallock). After his marriage he lived in Newline (also spelled New Line) in the parish of Rathgoggin, Co. Cork (near Charleville). Some years later, his job with the railway company brought the family to Cork city where they lived at 13 Marina Terrace for many years.

Michael died of cancer of the gall bladder. Michael O'SULLIVAN and Catherine MCDERMOTT were married on 22 Jan 1899 in Ballyhea, Charleville, Co. Cork. Witnesses to the marriage were James Swanton and Bridget McDermott.

Catherine MCDERMOTT, daughter of Peter MCDERMOTT and Ellen ROCHE, was born about 9 Sep 1870 in Ballyhea, Co. Cork. She was christened on 11 Sep 1870 in Ballyhea, Co. Cork. She died on 17 Oct 1954 at the age of 84 in 13 Marina Terrace, Cork. Catherine was buried in Holy Cross Cemetery, Charleville, Co. Cork. Catherine, whose family home was in Castlewrixon, Ballyhea, was one of 14 children. She appears to have had a mischievous streak as there is a story told about the time she visited the United States and called to see her eldest brother, John, in Westfield, Massachusetts; when he opened the door she realised he did not recognise her so she told him she was selling Singer sewing machines. He told her he wasn't interested so she went away but returned and knocked on the door again. John, quite irritated at this stage, told her to go away, that he was definitely not interested in buying a sewing machine. 'Well', Catherine responded, "would you buy one from your sister?!".

Catherine was a dressmaker, according to both the 1901 and 1911 censuses, the 1911 census also telling us that she and Michael had eight children born alive, seven of whom were living at the time of the census. Considering these seven survived to adulthood, it is unusual that Catherine and Michael had no grandchildren (although three of the seven entered religious life and one never married).

Catherine and Michael also raised Mary Ann, Sean and Ellen Roche, three children of her sister Christina who died in 1924 when the children were very young. (It is possible Christina and her husband, John, had more than three children but I only know of those raised by the O'Sullivans.)

Michael O'SULLIVAN and Catherine MCDERMOTT had the following children:

- +32 i **Michael Joseph O'SULLIVAN**, born 25 Jul 1900, Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork; married Marie Albertina Ottilie ROEDELBRONN, 16 Dec 1931, Greenwich, Connecticut; died 11 May 1953, Greenwich, Connecticut.
- 33 ii **Peter O'SULLIVAN** was born on 6 Oct 1901 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. He died on 8 Oct 1921 at the age of 20 in St. Patrick's Hospital, Cork. He was buried in Charleville, Co. Cork. Peter died of tuberculosis aged just 20. The date on his headstone in the cemetery adjoining Charleville Church gives his date of death as 8 October 1921 although his death record reads 10 October.
- +34 iii **Ellen (Nellie) O'SULLIVAN**, born 24 Feb 1903, Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork; married Bernard (Barney) HARGADEN, aft 17 Oct 1954; died 28 Jan 1996, Charleville, Co. Cork.



John Joseph (Fr. Ephrem) O'SULLIVAN was born on 20 Mar 1904 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. He died on 12 Jul 1958 at the age of 54 in Dublin. He was buried in Glasnevin Cemetery, Dublin. John was a member of the Fianna movement during the War of Independence. Following the subsequent Civil War he joined the Capuchin order and was ordained in Cork in June 1931, becoming Fr. Ephrem. He was sent to minister in the United States where he lived for five or six years. I have been told he served in Hermiston and Bend, both in Oregon, during this time. However, the Our Lady of Angels (Capuchin order) website tells us "he was first stationed at Wilmington, Delaware (Holyoke). In 1934 he was appointed assistant pastor of Sacred Heart parish in Lincoln, Nebraska. During the

summer of 1935 he substituted at Aurora and Heartwell and during the winter he substituted at Superior and Nelson. Suring the summer of 1937 he was appointed pastor at Sacred Heart. He held this position for only one year (1937) since financial difficulties and other considerations forced the Capuchins to withdraw from the Lincoln diocese on December 9 1937. After leaving Nebraska he helped out in parish missions and novenas. In February 1938, Ephrem returned to Ireland".

In Ireland he ministered in Kilkenny for a number years prior to moving to Dublin where he lived in Raheny. At some point he also served at the Capuchin friary in Ards, Co. Donegal.

Owing to cardiac problems Fr. Ephrem's health was not good during the last year of his life. He died at the Capuchin Friary, Church St., Dublin aged 54.

- v **Patrick O'SULLIVAN** was born on 16 Mar 1905 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. He died on 6 Dec 1907 at the age of 2 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. Patrick died at the age of two from "convulsions", the duration of which was "14 hours".
- +37 vi **Margaret (Peggy) Mary O'SULLIVAN**, born 24 Jul 1906, Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork ; married Bartholomew (Bart) COTTER, 29 Jul 1944, St. Finbarr's Church, Cork City; died 1966, Cork.
 - vii David O'SULLIVAN was born on 25 Oct 1908 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. He died



on 25 Jul 1953 at the age of 44 in Cork. He was buried in Holy Cross Cemetery, Charleville, Co. Cork. David, who never married, lived in the family home at 13 Marina Terrace in Cork. He was a member of the clerical staff of the Cork Harbour Board and died, aged only 44, of tuberculosis at St. Joseph's Hospital, Mount Desert, Cork. His eldest brother, Michael, had died just 10 weeks before in the United States

Mary Catherine (Sr. Annunciata) O'SULLIVAN was born on 10 Sep 1910 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. She died on 3 Oct 1939 at the age of 29 in Yaba, Nigeria. She was buried in Lagos, Nigeria. Mary Catherine was known as Kathleen. She was educated at the Mercy convent in Charleville and, in 1926, entered the Missionary Sisters of Our Lady of Apostles (OLA) convent at Ardfoyle, Ballintemple, Cork, where she was professed two years later. Kathleen left for Nigeria in 1931 and spent seven years teaching at St. Agnes's College in Yaba. In 1938 she fell ill and returned to Ireland to recuperate. In June 1939, after a year at home, she returned to Yaba, where, three months later, she died of blackwater fever, a form of malaria. In the convent's cemetery at Ardfoyle there is a statue

donated by her family in memory of her.

- ix Catherine (Sr. Dympna) O'SULLIVAN was born on 29 Aug 1914 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. She was christened on 2 Sep 1914 in Holy Cross Church, Charleville. She died on 20 Apr 1982 at the age of 67 in Ennis, Co. Clare. Catherine was buried in Poor Clare Monastery Cemetery, Ennis, Co. clare. Catherine entered the Poor Clare Monastery in College Road, Cork in 1933 and was professed in 1938. Sr. Dympna, as she became, was appointed vicaress of the College Road monastery in 1952. The College Road community then founded the Blantyre Monastery in Scotland and Sr. Dympna was abbess there from 1957 to 1962. After the Ennis monastery was established, Sr. Dympna was transferred there as novice mistress and was shortly afterwards appointed abbess.
- 13. **James (Jamesy Dan) O'SULLIVAN** (Daniel (Dan)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born about 10 Jan 1883 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 10 Jan 1883 in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died in Jun 1966 at the age of 83. James was buried in Gouldshill Cemetery, Mallow, Co. Cork. Jamesy Dan ran the family farm in Glynn, Mourneabbey. James (Jamesy Dan) O'SULLIVAN and Catherine (Kate) MURPHY were married.

Catherine (Kate) MURPHY was born about 1898 in Grenagh, Co. Cork. She died on 15 Jan 1959 at the age of 61 in Mallow, Co. Cork. She was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery, Garryclone, Blarney, Co. Cork.

James (Jamesy Dan) O'SULLIVAN and Catherine (Kate) MURPHY had the following children:

- i **Daniel (Dan) O'SULLIVAN** died on 10 Apr 2011. He was born in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was buried in Oldcourt Cemetery, Doneraile, Co. Cork. Dan lived in Limerick. I do not know if he ever married or had a family.
- +42 ii Patrick (Paddy) O'SULLIVAN, born Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; died 9 Sep 2007.
- +43 iii **Margaret O'SULLIVAN**, born Dec 1927, Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Herbert Walter BURNHAM, 1954, Coventry; died 5 Dec 2014, probably Coventry.
 - iv **'unknown' O'SULLIVAN (twin)** was born about 1928. He/she held the title of (twin). He/she was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Co. Cork. 'Unknown' died of the flu as an infant.
 - v 'unknown' O'SULLIVAN (twin) was born about 1928. He/she held the title of (twin). He/she was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Co. Cork. 'Unknown' died of the flu as an infant.
- +46 vi **Kathleen O'SULLIVAN**, born 1929, Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Patrick KINSELLA, 1955, Islington, London; died Oct 2000, London.
- vii **John O'SULLIVAN** died on 16 Feb 2004. He was born in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was buried in Gouldshill Cemetery, Mallow, Co. Cork. John lived with his brother Paddy in Glynn, Mourneabbey. He is buried with his father and uncle Dan.

Denis O'SULLIVAN, born Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; died 17 Aug 2011.

19. **James (Jimmy) O'SULLIVAN** (James (Big Jim)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 17 Dec 1883 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 17 Dec 1883 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 6 Oct 1959 at the age of 75 in Waterford. James was buried in Ferrybank, Co. Waterford. According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Jimmy's baptism were James Doody and Mary Ann Murphy. It is possible that Mary Ann Murphy was Jimmy's aunt, "Big Mary" Murphy.

Jimmy worked for the railway company. At the time of his marriage in 1918 he was working as a railway guard in Waterford city (his address was Sally Park in Waterford); by the time his baby daughter Maura died in 1920 he was a stationmaster in Dunmore Upper, Co. Kilkenny; and at the time of the death of his infant twins, Maura and Michael, 11 years later he was a signalman at Castlecomer Junction, Dunmore. James (Jimmy) O'SULLIVAN and Mary (Mollie) MURPHY were married on 10 Jun 1918 in Church of St. Mary, Cahir, Co. Tipperary.

Mary (Mollie) MURPHY, daughter of Patrick MURPHY and Alice 'UNKNOWN', was born on 5 Nov 1891 in Cahir, Co. Tipperary. She died on 11 Aug 1968 at the age of 76 in Kilkenny. Mary's address at the time of her marriage in 1918 was Church St., Cahir.

James (Jimmy) O'SULLIVAN and Mary (Mollie) MURPHY had the following children:

- i Mary (Maura) Ann O'SULLIVAN was born on 25 Mar 1919 in Dunmore Upper, Co. Kilkenny. She died on 3 May 1920 at the age of 1 in Dunmore Upper, Co. Kilkenny. Maura died at the age of 13 months from bronco-pneumonia from which she had been suffering for 14 days.
- 50 ii **Julia (Sr. Aquinas) O'SULLIVAN** was born on 27 May 1920 in Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny. She died on 5 Jan 2004 at the age of 83 in Drogheda, Co. Louth. She was buried in Ballapousta Cemetery, Ardee, Co. Louth. Sr. Aquinas was Reverend Mother at the Convent of Mercy in Dundalk, Co. Louth. She retired to Ardee, Co. Louth.
- +51 iii **James (Jimmy) O'SULLIVAN**, born 5 Jun 1921, Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny; married Sheila FITZGIBBON, 13 Apr 1953, Waterford; died 9 Jul 2011, Limerick.
- +52 iv **Alice (Leshia) O'SULLIVAN**, born 31 Jul 1922, Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny; married Patrick (Paddy) CARROLL, 10 Sep 1952, Waterford; died 1 Jan 1999, Thurles, Co. Tipperary.
- +53 v Mary Ellen (Eileen) O'SULLIVAN, born 8 Jan 1924, Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny; married James Ernest (Ernie) HARRINGTON, 17 Feb 1953, Waterford; died 19 Mar 2016, Kilkenny
- vi **Patrick O'SULLIVAN**, born 1 May 1925, Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny; died 16 May 1979, Auckland, New Zealand.

Kitty entered the Sacred Heart of Mary Convent, becoming Sr. Constance. She lived in Lisburn, Northern Ireland and in England, later returning to Ireland where she lived in Ferrybank, Waterford.
- 57 ix Mary (Maura) O'SULLIVAN was born on 20 Jan 1931 in Castlecomer Junction,
 Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny. She died on 9 Feb 1931 at the age of 0 in Castlecomer Junction,
 Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny. Maura died just 20 days after her birth from [what looks like on
 her death record] "Premature Birth Syncope". Her twin, Michael, had died just two days
 previously from the same condition.

Michael O'SULLIVAN was born on 20 Jan 1931 in Castlecomer Junction, Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny. He died on 7 Feb 1931 at the age of 0 in Castlecomer Junction, Dunmore, Co. Kilkenny. Michael died just 18 days after birth from [what looks like on his death record] "Premature Birth Syncope". His twin, Maura, died of the same condition two days later.

- 59 xi **Siobhan O'SULLIVAN** was born on 16 Aug 1932 in Waterford. She died on 26 Apr 1952 at the age of 19 in New Zealand. Siobhan entered the convent but died not long afterwards at the age of 19, while still a novice. She was a member of the Mercy order in Auckland, New Zealand, her name in religion being Sr. Mary St. James.
- +60 xii **Bridget (Breda) O'SULLIVAN**, born 8 Nov 1934, Waterford; married Thomas RYAN, 1975, Sydney; died 23 Aug 2017, Maryborough, Queensland.

20. **Johanna (Hannah) O'SULLIVAN** (James (Big Jim)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 23 Oct 1885 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She was christened on 25 Oct 1885 in Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She died on 15 Jan 1983 at the age of 97 in 106 Victory St., Plymouth, Devon. According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Hannah's baptism were George Church and Elizabeth Doody.

Hannah emigrated to England as a young woman and settled in Plymouth. From the 1911 census we know she was working as a servant at 8 Lockyer St., Plymouth, which appears to be a house attached to a school. She lived at this address up to the time of her marriage in 1915 as this address is provided on her marriage record. According to the 1911 census of her family back in Ireland, in which Hannah and several other absent children were listed in error (the enumerator has drawn a line through their details), Hannah was a nurse. It is evident that Hannah was not in fact a nurse. Perhaps she told her paents she worked as a nurse or perhaps her job in 1911 involved nursemaid duties.

Hannah and her husband, Harry, lived for many years at 251 Victoria Road, St. Budeaux, Plymouth. Harry predeceased Hannah by 27 years and it appears Hannah lived towards the end of her life at 106 Victory St., Plymouth, the home of her son and daughter-in-law, Dennis and Margaret. Hannah died of a cerebral thrombosis at the age of 97. Johanna (Hannah) O'SULLIVAN and Harry WILLIAMS were married on 26 Apr 1915 in R.C. Church of St. Mary and St. Boniface, Plymouth, Devon. Witnesses to the marriage of Hannah and Harry were Hannah Blackmore and George Herbert.

Harry WILLIAMS, son of Thomas WILLIAMS and Leah COKER, was born on 6 Oct 1887 in Devonport, Plymouth, Devon. He died on 19 Mar 1956 at the age of 68 in probably Plymouth. According to his marriage record (1915), Harry was a leading seaman in the Royal Navy. His address at the time of his marriage was the Sailors' Rest, Fore St., Devonport, Plymouth.

The 1939 Register tells us that Harry was a retired Chief Petty Officer in the Royal Navy. He was working at the time as a skilled electrician's labourer and was living with his family at 251 Victoria Road, St. Budeaux, Plymouth, which was also Harry's address at the time of his death.

Although it appears (from the FreeBMD website) that Harry died in 1956, the Calendar of Wills for 1956 states the following: "WILLIAMS Harry of 251 Victoria-road, St Budeaux, Plymouth, died 19 March 1954. Administration Exeter 23 May [this would be 23 May 1956] to Hannah Williams widow. Effects £352 10s." However, on balance, I think the year of death recorded in the Calendar of Wills incorrect and Harry in fact died in 1956.

Harry WILLIAMS and Johanna (Hannah) O'SULLIVAN had the following children:

61 i **Josephine L. WILLIAMS** was born in 1916 in Devonport, Plymouth, Devon. She died in 1918 at the age of 2 in Devonport, Plymouth, Devon. Josephine was only one year old when she died.

Harry Joseph WILLIAMS was born on 30 Jan 1919 in Devonport, Plymouth, Devon. He died on 28 Jan 1961 at the age of 41 in Freedom Fields Hospital, Plymouth. Harry, who was an electrician, was just 41 years of age when he died of a coronary thrombosis. From the Calendar of Wills for 1961 it appears that Harry lived at his mother's address, suggesting he never married:

"WILLIAMS Harry Joseph of 251 Victoria-road, St Budeaux, Plymouth, died 28 January 1961 at Freedom Fields Hospital. Administration Bodmin 24 July [i.e. 1961] to Hannah Williams widow. Effects £488 19s." Widow Hannah Williams most likely refers to Harry's mother, Hannah, the word "widow" relating to her status rather than indicating that she was the widow of Harry himself.

iii **Dennis Charles Patrick WILLIAMS**, born 1922, Devonport, Plymouth, Devon; died Sep 2016, Plymouth, Devon.

22. **Ellen O'SULLIVAN** (James (Big Jim)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 24 Oct 1887 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She was christened on 25 Oct 1887 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She died on 18 Sep 1972 at the age of 84 in Carrick-on-Suir, Co. Tipperary. Ellen was buried in New Cemetery, Carrick-on-Suir. According to Ellen's birth record, present at her birth was Mary O'Sullivan (probably her father's sister).

According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Ellen's baptism were Cornelius Sweeney and Julia Curtin. It is believed Cornelius Sweeney was a neighbour of the Sullivans and it is thought he was married to one of Caheraveelane Sullivans who were related to Ellen. A granddaughter of Cornelius

would later marry Ellen's brother Denis. Julia Curtin, the second sponsor, had been a neighbour of the Sullivans when they lived in Ballyknockane. Julia would later marry Sean O'Looney; they emigrated to the United States and had 12 children. Valuable information on the Sullivan family, for which I am so grateful, came in November 2003 from 96-year-old Patrick, known as Pats, Curtin, a nephew of Julia's who lived in Ballyknockane with one of his daughters. Sadly, Pats died in September 2004.

It is thought that Ellen, who was also known as Nellie, had some domestic training and subsequently became a parlour maid. I am told that she met her husband, Thomas Treacy, in Tipperary town where they were both working (Thomas worked at the gasworks in the town). Based on this information I believe I have located a 1911 census record for Ellen. An Ellen Sullivan, aged 24 (although our Ellen was actually 23 years of age at the time of the census) and born in Co. Cork, was working as a parlour maid at the home of law agent George Hugh Chetwood Townsend in Cordangan, just a couple of miles south of Tipperary town. It was a large house and, along with Ellen, six other servants are listed.

However, according to Ellen's marriage record, her residence at the time (January 1915) was Lavitt's Quay, Cork but it is not known how she came to move to Cork after apparently having met Thomas. She did have an uncle, Mike Doody, who was living at 5 Lavitt's Quay at the time of the 1911 census, while his wife, Mary Anne, was running a hotel at no 6. Perhaps Ellen was working at the hotel. Or perhaps, being from Co. Cork, Ellen wished to be married in Cork and therefore used her uncle's address to fulfil a possible residency requirement.

It is thought Ellen may have been related to a Hewitt family which included Patrick (1897-1979), a Holy Ghost priest who did missionary work in Tanganyika (now part of Tanzania), his brother James (1900-1974), a Holy Ghost brother who worked at Blackrock College in Dublin as a ground staff supervisor, and their sister Biddy who married a J.J. Healy and lived in Carrick-on-Suir. Other relatives of Ellen - or her husband, Thomas - included a couple who lived near Flamborough Head in Yorkshire in the 1940s. All we know of this

couple is that the husband was in the Merchant Navy. Could they have been Ellen's aunt Hannah (O'Sullivan) and her husband Harry Williams, who was in the Merchant Navy? Further information would be most welcome.

According to a newspaper death notice, Ellen died in St. Brigid's Hospital, Carrick-on-Suir. Ellen O'SULLIVAN and Thomas Joseph TREACY were married on 12 Jan 1915 in Church of S.S. Peter And Paul, Cork. Witnesses to Ellen and Thomas' marriage were "M. J. Treacy" (Thomas' brother, Martin?) and "Julia O'Sullivan" (Ellen's sister?).

Thomas Joseph TREACY, son of Thomas TREACY and Mary CAREY, was born on 13 Apr 1881 in Murgasty, Co. Tipperary. He was christened about 13 Apr 1881 in Tipperary. He died on 13 Apr 1969 at the age of 88 in Carrick-on-Suir, Co. Tipperary. Thomas died on his 88th birthday. Thomas was buried in New Cemetery, Carrick-on-Suir, Co. Tipperary. The sponsors at Thomas's baptism was Sarah Carew, probably his aunt. There was no other sponsor listed on the baptism record.

Thomas began his career working at the gasworks in Tipperary town; according to the 1911 census he was a "gas account collector". On 28 September 1914 he took over the management of the gasworks in Carrick-on-Suir (located on the Quay), eventually buying the Carrick gasworks from the owner, Mr. Anderson. I am unsure as to the year

of purchase but it would probably have been during the mid- or late 1930s as it is known that Mr. Anderson still owned the Carrick gasworks in 1933.

Difficulties in getting parts from England for gasworks repairs during World War II led to problems in manufacturing gas at the Carrick works so Thomas decided to switch to the making of charcoal and in 1942 the large gasometers were dismantled. The business eventually concentrated on the sales of coal, coke and briquettes, and subsequently incorporated sales of gas stoves and heaters.

Thomas Joseph TREACY and Ellen O'SULLIVAN had the following children:

i **Patrick TREACY** was born between 1915 and 1920 in Waterford. He died between 1915 and 1920 at the age of 0 in Waterford. Patrick died as an infant. I am told he was born and died in a nursing home in Waterford city. However, I can find no trace of a birth or death record for him (in both Carrick-on-Suir and Waterford registration districts).

Note: It is surprising Patrick was not named Thomas as it was traditional at the time to name the eldest son after his paternal grandfather. Searches have been carried out for birth and death records for a Thomas Treacy, just in case (in both Carrick-on-Suir and Waterford registration districts), but nothing was found.

ii Mary Frances (Joan) TREACY was born on 20 Aug 1920 in Carrick-on-Suir, Co.



Tipperary. She died on 23 Oct 2003 at the age of 83 in Haywards Heath, West Sussex. She was buried in Shanganagh Cemetery, Dublin. The name on Joan's birth certificate is Mary Frances and on her baptism certificate it is Mary Bridget. However, she was called Joan by her family, although her nursing records are in the name of Mary Frances. She used the name is name for most of her life until after her retirement when she changed it to Jo-Ann.

Jo-Ann trained as a nurse in Manchester, qualifying in 1944. She had always wanted to travel so, following a number of years of general and industrial nursing in the UK, she joined the QARANC (Queen

Alexandra's Royal Army Nursing Corps) in 1952. Her first foreign posting was to Benghazi

in Libya in 1953, followed by Cyprus in 1954.

Jo-Ann returned to England in 1956 and, while working at Shorncliffe Military Hospital, decided she wanted to specialise in nurse training. She embarked on a two-year course in Hull University, obtaining a Diploma in Nurse Training and Education in 1959, after which she spent many years training student nurses overseas during postings to Germany, Hong Kong and Singapore. In 1963, while serving in Hong Kong, she was awarded an Associate Royal Red Cross (ARRC) medal for exceptional services in military nursing.

Following her permanent return to England in 1970 Jo-Ann continued to train nurses at the military hospitals in Tidworth, Colchester, Aldershot and Woolwich. She retired in 1975 as Director of Studies at Woolwich and as acting colonel. She lived briefly in Brighton following her retirement before settling in Henfield in West Sussex. Jo-Ann never married although it is believed that she was engaged in the 1950s, possibly to a military doctor. Sadly, the marriage never took place because apparently her fiancé was killed in a bomb explosion in Cyprus, about which we have no details.

Jo-Ann died in hospital in Haywards Heath, West Sussex.

He was christened on 19 Jan 1890 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 16 Mar 1975 at the age of 85 in Athlone, Co. Westmeath. According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Jack's baptism were Patrick Regan and Elizabeth Crean.

Jack was a railway company employee. John (Jack) O'SULLIVAN and Josephine (Jo) SHAW were married on 24 Aug 1926 in New Ross, Co. Wexford.

Josephine (Jo) SHAW was born on 1 May 1894 in possibly New Ross, Co. Wexford. She died on 14 Apr 1977 at the age of 82 in probably Athlone, Co. Westmeath. I am told Jo may have come from New Ross, Co. Wexford, which seems likely as she was married married there. Jo and her husband, Jack, lived in Dungarvan, Co. Waterford, later moving to Fairville, College Road, Cork before retiring to Athlone, Co. Westmeath.

John (Jack) O'SULLIVAN and Josephine (Jo) SHAW had the following children:

24. **Eugene O'SULLIVAN** (James (Big Jim)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 1 Apr 1893 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 3 Apr 1893 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 31 Dec 1988 at the age of 95 in Wahroonga, New South Wales. According to Eugene's birth record, a Bridget Connell was present at his birth. The record also tells us Eugene was born on 6 April 1893, but according to his family he was born on 1 April 1893, which ties in with baptism information from the Mallow Heritage Centre which tells us he was christened on 3 April. Baptismal records were normally more reliable than birth records in those days as baptisms were registered on the day whereas births were often registered weeks after the event when exact birth dates were often remembered inaccurately. Sponsors at Eugene's baptism were John Doody and Ellen Cashman. The given name on Eugene's

baptism record is "Owen" ("Owen" is an equivalent of "Eugene"). In the 1901 census, Eugene is listed as "Ewen".

In 1914, at the age of 20, Eugene emigrated to Australia, never to return to Ireland. On the voyage (which cost him £12) he chose to work on board, unlike many of the other men, and was consequently quite fit when the ship docked in Melbourne. As a result he was quickly offered a job as a farm labourer. Eugene spent most, if not all, of his early years in Australia working on sugar cane farms in Queenland, eventually buying a small sugar cane farm of his own. He was later able to purchase a larger property in South Johnstone near Innisfail in Far North Queensland. He and his wife, Jane, lived in South Johnstone for 28 years before selling the farm and moving to The Corso in Innisfail in 1953. They later moved to Sydney and lived with their daughter, Mary, and her family in Wahroonga.

Eugene died at the age of 95 and Jane at 91. Eugene O'SULLIVAN and Jane MCCLELLAND were married on 4 Feb 1925 in Queensland.

Jane MCCLELLAND was born on 5 Oct 1902 in Belfast. She died on 22 Sep 1994 at the age of 91 in Sydney. Jane emigrated to Australia in 1923, aged 21. The ship manifest tells us she left London on 23 May of that year, her destination was Brisbane, her occupation was a weaver, and her previous address was 29 Ambleside St., Belfast.

Eugene O'SULLIVAN and Jane MCCLELLAND had the following child:

+71 i **Mary Ann O'SULLIVAN**, born 21 Aug 1925, Queensland; married Maurice Francis RODGERS, 6 Sep 1952, Innisfail, Queensland; died 18 May 1999, Sydney.



25. **Denis O'SULLIVAN** (James (Big Jim)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born about 28 Jul 1895 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He was christened on 28 Jul 1895 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on 31 May 1971 at the age of 75 in Mallow, Co. Cork. Denis was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. According to information from the Mallow Heritage Centre, the sponsors at Denis's baptism were Richard Murphy and Mary Dennehy. According to his marriage record from 1920, he was a railway worker at the time, while the birth record of his daughter Maura a year later tells us he was a farmer. Denis O'SULLIVAN and Mary SWEENEY were married on 14 Feb 1920 in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork.



Mary SWEENEY, daughter of Jeremiah (Jerry) SWEENEY and Mary 'UNKNOWN', was born about 1900 in U.S.. She died on 21 Jan 1978 at the age of 78 in Mallow, Co. Cork. She was buried in Donoughmore New Cemetery, Co. Cork. Mary was an only child. She grew up in Kilquane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork following the family's return home after a period living in the United States. Her surname is sometimes documented as McSweeney.

Mary's paternal grandmother is thought to have been a member of the Sullivan family of Caheraveelane, Glantane, Co. Cork, to which Mary's husband, Denis was also connected. However, I have so far been unable to determine how Mary's grandmother might fit into the Caheraveelane family.

Denis O'SULLIVAN and Mary SWEENEY had the following children:

- v Eugene O'SULLIVAN was born in 1931 in Kilquane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. He died on

28 Sep 1967 at the age of 36 in Lusk, Co. Dublin. He was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. Eugene emigrated to Australia in 1950, working initially for his uncle Eugene (O'Sullivan) cutting cane in Innisfail, Queensland. He then moved to Brisbane where he was employed as a dock worker for a time before moving to Sydney where he worked at the docks (possibly as a crane driver) and in the painting and decorating business. Eugene never married. He was a fine singer, and he and his brothers, Jim and Jerry were well known among the Irish community in the city.

Eugene was a superb athlete, a newspaper article describing him as "the Brisbane wharfie and distance runner who has broken every Queensland record from three miles to ten miles". At the age of 25, sponsored by the Waterside Workers' Federation, he had the opportunity to train with world champions Vladimir Kuts and Emil Zatopek in Moscow. On his way to Russia Eugene won a 3,000 metre steeplechase in Canton (now Guangzhou) and a 5,000 metre event in Peking (now Beijing), beating the Chinese champion, Chin Chow, on both occasions. While in Moscow he competed in the World Youth Festival where he finished third.

Selected to represent Australia at the 1956 Olympics in Melbourne, Eugene turned down the opportunity as it would have required him to take Australian citizenship, meaning he would have to pledge allegiance to the Queen, an obligation he was unwilling to fulfil. Efforts were then made by the Australian Olympic Council to arrange for him to represent Ireland. The Irish Olympic Council, however, set a standard equal to Australian record time which Eugene could not meet and so he never took part in the Games.

The photo above shows Eugene winning The Hungry Mile road race (actually 1.7 miles) in Sydney in late May or early June 1966.

Hannah O'SULLIVAN, born 1929, Kilquane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork; married Frederick (Fred) W. BINGE, 1957, Harrow, London; died 10 Mar 2021, Enniskeane, Co. Cork.

26. **Margaret (Madge) O'SULLIVAN** (James (Big Jim)-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 27 Nov 1897 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She died on 21 Apr 1925 at the age of 27 in Glynn, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. She was christened in Analeentha Church, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork. Margaret was buried in Donoughmore Cemetery, Stuake, Co. Cork. Madge died died of tuberculosis aged only 27. She is buried with her parents in the O'Sullivan family plot in Donoughmore Cemetery, although her name is not listed on the headstone.

Jack, her husband, finding himself unable to raise three small children on his own, placed them in an orphanage for a time. Margaret (Madge) O'SULLIVAN and John (Jack) LYNCH were married on 2 May 1918 in Burnfort Church, Glantane, Co. Cork.

John (Jack) LYNCH, son of Daniel LYNCH, was born on 1 Jul 1882 in Raynaree, Macroom, Co. Cork. He died on 16 May 1966 at the age of 83 in Nazareth House, Mallow, Co. Cork. He was buried in St. Columba's Cemetery, Bweeng, Mallow, Co. Cork. Jack was a farmer. Madge was his second wife, his first wife, with whom he had two sons, having died. Jack had been living in Kilquane, Mourneabbey, Co. Cork before his marriage to Madge and later lived with Madge and their young family in Glynn in the cottage where Madge had grown up. The cottage eventually passed to a nephew of Jack's third wife, Ellie, but it is not known if it remains in the ownership of this nephew's family. It was derelict when seen by me around 2004.

John (Jack) LYNCH and Margaret (Madge) O'SULLIVAN had the following children:

30. Catherine (Kate) MAHONY (Hanora (Nora) Sullivan-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 10 May 1874 in Ballyknockane, Mourneabbey, Co . Cork. She died on 12 Feb 1933 at the age of 58 in 15 Kilbarry Cottages, Cork. It appears Kate was born a week after her parents' marriage.

Kate's address at the time of her own marriage in 1898 was 65 Commons Road, Cork.

Kate died of "auricular fibrillation" aged 58. Catherine (Kate) MAHONY and Timothy LYNCH were married on 30 Apr 1898 in Cork Cathedral. Witnesses to the marriage were John Lynch and Nora Healy.

Timothy LYNCH, son of John LYNCH, was born about 1870 in Co. Cork. He died on 21 Feb 1952 at the age of 82 in 16 Langford Row, Cork. Timothy was a railway porter. His address at the time of his marriage was 96 Clarence St., Cork, and at the time of the 1901 census he and his wife, Kate, and their family were living on Great Britain St., Blackpool, Cork. At the time of the death of their infant son Jeremiah in 1906 the family appears to have been still living on Great Britain St. as Jeremiah was born and died at no. 71 Great Britain St. However the address of Kate, who was the informant named on Jeremiah's death certificate, is given as 47 Kellehers Buildings, Cork. By the time of the 1911 census the family home was in Kilbarry, St. Mary's, Cork.

Timothy died at the home of his daughter Nora (Donnelly).

Timothy LYNCH and Catherine (Kate) MAHONY had the following children:

i Ellen Mary LYNCH was born on 4 Feb 1899 in 32 Great Britain St., Cork. She died

before probably 30 Mar 1901 at the age of 2 in probably Cork city. The 1911 census tells us that Ellen's parents had six children born alive, four of whom were still living. We know that their son Jeremiah had died in 1906, and as Ellen is not listed with her family in the 1901 census I am presuming that she had died by then and that she was the second child who had died. The Civil Registration Deaths Index on the Ancestry website has an Ellen Mary Lynch who died aged less than one year in the Cork registration district in the third quarter of 1899. However the corresponding death record does not appear on the Irish Genealogy site so I have been unable to view the record to verify that the index entry refers to our Ellen above, although I think it likely that it does.

- 82 ii Mary LYNCH was born on 14 Dec 1900 in The Lying-In Hospital, Cork. Mary's birth certificate gives her name as Nora Christina but it is definitely Mary who is listed in the 1901 census as the three-month-old daughter of Timothy and Kate.
- iii **John LYNCH** was born on 12 Jun 1902 in 71 Great Britain St., Cork.
- iv **Julia LYNCH** was born on 19 Feb 1905 in The Lying-In Hospital, Cork. I think it likely Julia married a Patrick Kennedy as a marriage record has been found on the Irish Genealogy website (www.irishgenealogy.ie) for a Julia Lynch, daughter of Timothy Lynch, who married Patrick Kennedy, a soldier, on 22 January 1944 in the Church of St. Joseph in Mayfield, Cork. Witnesses were John Hickey and Mary Lynch (Julia had a sister named MAry).
- v **Jeremiah LYNCH** was born on 21 Mar 1906 in 71 Great Britain St., Cork. He died on 10 May 1906 at the age of 0 in 71 Great Britain St., Cork. Jeremiah died at the age of seven weeks of "debility from birth".
- +86 vi **Hanora (Nora) LYNCH**, born 8 Jul 1910, 15 Kilbarry Cottages, Cork; married Joseph (Joe) DONNELLY, 2 Apr 1945, Cork Cathedral, Cork; died aft 15 Apr 1990, probably Cork.
- vii Anne (Hannah) Christina (Sr. Columbanus) LYNCH was born on 24 Dec 1913 in 15



Kilbarry Cottages, Blackpool, Cork. She died on 15 Apr 1990 at the age of 76 in Galway. Hannah (Sr. Columbanus) entered the convent of the Missionary Sisters of Our Lady of Apostles (OLA) in 1934 and was professed two years later. She worked in Egypt, Gold Coast (now Ghana), England and Ireland. Sr. Columbanus spent her retirement at the OLA convent in Castlemacgarret, Claremorris, Co. Mayo, where the order has a home for the elderly. Hannah died at the Regional Hospital in Galway.

32. **Michael Joseph O'SULLIVAN** (Michael-3, Michael-2, James (Seamus)-1) was born on 25 Jul 1900 in Newline, Charleville, Co. Cork. He died on 11 May 1953 at the age of 52 in Greenwich, Connecticut. He was buried on 13 May 1953 in St. Mary's Cemetery, Greenwich, Connecticut. Michael was a member of Cork No. 1 Brigade of the Old IRA before emigrating to the United States. He worked initially in New York and is likely to have been the Michael O'Sullivan residing with the family of Robert Bacon in Old Westbury, Nassau, New York and employed as a butler in the 1930 U.S. Census (Robert Low Bacon was a U.S. Congressman, representing the First New York District). Michael moved to Greenwich, Connecticut prior to his marriage in 1931 to Marie Roedelbronn, whom he appears to have met in New York. He was employed as a butler in Greenwich at the time of his marriage and worked as a butler for many more

years before joining the Electrolux company in Greenwich as a clerk around 1947. He later worked as a clerk for a stationery company.

From 1937 to 1955 Michael and Marie are listed in Polk's Greenwich Directory as residing at 13 Benedict Court, Greenwich. They had no children.

According to his death record, Michael died in Greenwich Hospital aged 52 from cirrhosis of the liver brought on by loss of appetite and malnutrition resulting from a gastrectomy he had undergone in 1950. Michael Joseph O'SULLIVAN and Marie Albertina Ottilie ROEDELBRONN were married on 16 Dec 1931 in Greenwich, Connecticut.



Marie Albertina Ottilie ROEDELBRONN, daughter of Johann Paul ROEDELBRONN and Wilhemine Elisabethe 'UNKNOWN', was born on 8 Aug 1896 in Frankfurt, Germany. She died on 16 Dec 1979 at the age of 83 in Greenwich, Connecticut. Following the death of her first husband, Heinrich Voekler, Marie emigrated to the United States in 1922. Although the ship's manifest tells us her final destination was Baltimore, Maryland to join her aunt Marie Sauer, Marie (Voekler) filed her Declaration of Intention the following year at the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York. She was residing at that time at 541 Lexington Avenue. By the time of the 1925 New York State Census, Marie was employed as a parlor maid by the Lowenstein family at 24 West 74th St. When the 1930 Census was taken, she was employed as a servant in the household of financier Ralph H. Ishan, of Old

Brookville, Nassau, New York just five miles from Old Westbury, Nassau, New York where it appears her future husband, Michael, was working at the time. It therefore appears the couple met in New York before settling in Greenwich, Connecticut (they married there in December 1931).

I am told by Diane Molnar, a great-granddaughter of a Gustav Roedelbronn who emigrated from Germany in 1895, that Roedelbronn is a very unusual name in the U.S., although there are many Rodels and Roeds, which could possibly be the result of name-shortening. Diane, whose Roedelbronn family settled in New Jersey, is not aware of any connection between her family and Marie's, but she does know of a Roedelbronn family (possibly related to her) who settled in Wisconsin; and in the 1880 census of the United States she found information on two Roedelbronn households (unrelated to her, as far as she knows) who had settled in Massachusetts. Their details are as follows:

I think it very likely that this is our Joe's birth record as the date ties in with our Joe's age at death (59). Also, Nora, our Joe's wife, grew up at 65 Common Road.

The marriage record of Joe and Nora tells us that Joe, a widower, was a shopkeeper and living at 16 Langford Row in Cork at the time (1945). By the time of his death eight years later he had become an engine driver. Joe died of a coronary thrombosis aged about 60.
